THE FORMER CHAMPS: The first round matchup of Auburn vs. Notre Dame features two former champions of the Vivid Seats Legends Classic presented by Old Trapper. Auburn (then #18) won the tournament in 2019, beating New Mexico 84-59 in the Semifinals and Richmond 79-65 for the title. Notre Dame won the trophy in 2016, topping Colorado 89-83 in the Semifinals and Northwestern 70-66 in the Finals.

THE MAN: Shamorie Ponds rewrote the Vivid Seats Legends Classic presented by Old Trapper record book in 2018, setting tournament records for total points (108) and points in the championship rounds (67), among others. In all, the St. John's guard set or tied six tournament records. His 108 points broke A.J. Abrams' mark of 103 total points that had stood since the inaugural Classic in 2007.

SELECT COMPANY: In the last 12 NBA drafts, 27 players who have played in the Vivid Seats Legends Classic presented by Old Trapper have been selected in the first round. A pair of Michigan guards, Jett Howard and Kobe Bufkin, were drafted 11th and 15th in 2023.

CATAPULTING INTO THE RANKINGS:

Recently, in 2021 Providence entered the Classic with a 4-0 record before falling to Virginia in the Championship game. After that loss, the Friars went on an eight-game winning streak and won 16 of their next 17 games to peak at No. 8 in both polls en route to a Sweet 16 appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

In the history of the event, two Vivid Seats Legends Classic presented by Old Trapper participants eventually reached No. 1 in the polls. In 2007, No. 7 Tennessee, which lost in the title game to No. 16 Texas, would move into the top spot the week of Feb. 25, 2008. In 2008, Legends champ and fourth-ranked Pitt would eventually move to No. 1 for three weeks. Indiana, which played in the 2012 event, entered the Legends Classic ranked No. 1 and would stay there for 10 weeks.

Florida entered the 2009 Legends Classic unranked. However, dominant Regional Round wins over Troy and Georgia Southern preceded a stunning 77-74 win over No. 2 Michigan State and a 73-58 championship game victory versus Rutgers resulted in the Gators going from unranked to No. 13 in the nation two days after the Legends Classic concluded. In 2014, Villanova entered the Legends Classic ranked No. 12. After winning the tournament, the Wildcats continued their success before ending the season ranked No. 2 in the AP poll.

THE LEGENDS

Marquis Daniels – Auburn

A two-time All-Southeastern Conference selection and 10-year NBA veteran, Marquis Daniels was a key figure in leading Auburn to two NCAA Tournament appearances from 1999-2003. He is in his fifth overall season on the coaching staff at his alma mater, where he currently serves as director of player development. During his senior year, Daniels led the 10th-seeded Tigers to a Sweet 16 appearance, recording game highs of 27 points and nine rebounds to help Auburn erase a double-digit deficit with a chance to knock off eventual national champion Syracuse. Named SEC Player of the Year by the Birmingham News and SEC Most Valuable Player by ColleagueInsider.com in 2003, he graduated in 3.5 years with a bachelor's degree in sociology and later a master's degree in adult education. Daniels still ranks third in the school record books in career steals (208) and 11th all-time in career scoring (1,532 points). A native of Orlando, Florida, he amassed 4,319 career points, 1,552 career rebounds and 509 career steals as a member of the Dallas Mavericks (2003-06), Indiana Pacers (2006-09), Boston Celtics (2009-12) and Milwaukee Bucks (2012-13) combined. Daniels was honored as a SEC Men's Basketball Legend in 2017 and inducted into the City of Auburn's Tiger Trail Class of 2022.



LaPhonso Ellis – Notre Dame

Ellis donned the Irish jersey from 1988-1992, finishing his career as the all-time leading shot blocker (200), third-leading rebounder (1,075) and eighth on the all-time scoring list (1,505). Upon completion of his time at Notre Dame, Ellis was just the fourth Irish player to score 1,000 points and grab 1,000 rebounds.

During his senior season in 1991-92, Ellis averaged 20.6 points, 11.0 rebounds and shot .679 from the field against ranked opponents. That final season for Ellis at Notre Dame is one of the finest for a frontcourt player in program history. Recording 22 double-doubles (third best for a single season), Ellis shot 63 percent from the field while scoring 17.7 points per game and pulling down 11.7 rebounds per contest.

Ellis helped three Irish teams to postseason appearances, including a first-round NCAA tournament victory over Vanderbilt in 1989. He capped the 1992 season by leading the Irish to the NIT Championship game, earning all-tournament honors. In keeping with Ellis' penchant for stepping up against the best competition, he averaged 17.0 points, 12.5 rebounds and shot 55 percent from the field in seven postseason performances.

He was the fifth overall pick of the 1992 NBA Draft by the Denver Nuggets, earning first-team all-rookie honors with the squad after the 1992-93



season. He helped the Nuggets make history in the 1994 postseason as they became the first No. 8 playoff seed to defeat at No. 1 seed (Seattle). Over his 11-year NBA career, Ellis played for the Nuggets, Atlanta Hawks, Minnesota Timberwolves and Miami Heat, scoring over 7,400 points (11.9 average) with over 4,000 rebounds (6.5 average).

Bob Lanier – St. Bonaventure

The No. 1 overall NBA Draft pick by the Detroit Pistons in 1970, Lanier led the Bonnies to an undefeated regular season in 1968 (23-0) and the NCAA Final Four in 1970.

In his first varsity season, the 6-11 Lanier and his teammates put together an undefeated regular season and a No. 3 national ranking before losing to North Carolina in the second round of the NCAA tourney. Lanier averaged 26.2 points and 15.6 rebounds per game.

A silky-smooth left-hander with a lethal hook shot and mid-range jumper, Lanier averaged 27.2 points and 15.5 rebounds a game his junior year and 29.1 points and 16 rebounds his senior season. He was a consensus All-American each season.

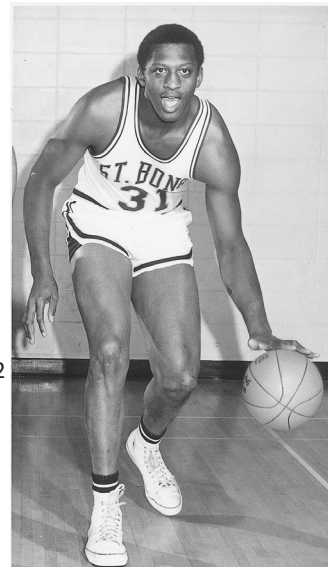
Lanier finished his 75-game career as the St. Bonaventure record holder in seven categories: career scoring (2,067 points); career points per game (27.6); career rebounding (1,180); single-game scoring (51 points vs. Seton Hall); single-game rebounding (27 vs. Loyola, Md.); single-season rebounding (416); and average rebounds in one season (16) in 1969-1970.

In 52 years, only his career points record has been surpassed — by three men who played 29, 37 and 48 more games than Lanier did, when freshmen were allowed to play varsity (after 1972) and schedules grew larger.

An eight-time NBA All-Star and member of the 1970-71 All-Rookie team, Lanier scored more than 19,000 points over his 14-year career with Detroit and Milwaukee, averaging 20.1 points, 10.1 rebounds, 3.1 assists, 1.5 blocks, and 1.1 steals while shooting 51.4 percent from the field. The MVP of the 1974 NBA All-Star game, Lanier had his No. 16 jersey retired by the Pistons and Bucks, to whom Lanier was traded in 1980. Lanier was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 1992.

John Starks - Oklahoma State

John Starks played just one year in Stillwater but made his mark, averaging 15.4 points, 4.6 assists and 2.2 steals during the 1987-88 season on his way to All-Big 8 honors. Known for his physical play and fiery intensity, Starks went on to become one of the most successful undrafted players in NBA history with more than 10,000 career points over 13 seasons. His best years came in New York as a member of the Knicks (1990-98). He was an all-star in 1994 on a team that reached the NBA Finals and was the league's sixth man of the year in 1997.

A BRIEF HISTORY

2022 - Arizona State upset #20 Michigan in the Vivid Seats Legends Classic championship game with a dominant 87-62 win. The Sun Devils won their two games by an average of 14.5 points en route to the school's first Legends Classic title. Desmond Cambridge took home MVP honors after averaging 15 ppg in the event. VCU defeated Pittsburgh in the consolation game.

2021 - Virginia's stifling defense limited Georgia and Providence to a combined 30% shooting from the field in winning the Roman Legends Classic presented by Old Trapper championship in its first-ever appearance. Jayden Gardner earned MVP honors for averaging 18.0 ppg and 9.9 rpg.

2020 - Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the event featured four games rather than a tournament format. The games were held at Mohegan Sun and saw UConn, USC, BYU, Boston College, St. John's, and Florida compete. No champion was declared. Evan Mobley of USC was named the event's MVP.

2019 - A pair of double-digit wins led No. 18 Auburn to the title of the Roman Legends Classic presented by Old Trapper. Austin Wiley, healthy for the first time, stormed through the competition to garner MVP honors, averaging 16.0 ppg and 10.5 rpg while shooting 12-of-15 from the floor. Teammate Samir Doughty averaged 20.5 ppg to lead all scorers. The Tigers downed New Mexico (84-59) and Richmond (79-65) to take home the trophy. New Mexico took third place with a 59-50 win over Wisconsin.

2018 - Shamorie Ponds set a Legends Classic championship round scoring record in leading St. John's to the 2018 title. Ponds scored 35 points and had seven assists and seven steals as the Red Storm came from behind to beat VCU, 87-86 in overtime. He was clutch down the stretch, hitting a layup with 28 seconds left in regulation to put the Red Storm up 73-72, and in overtime scoring eight points, including the game-winning lay-up with four seconds remaining. Ponds' 67 points broke one of the oldest Legends Classic records. The previous mark of 52 was set in the inaugural Legends Classic in 2007 by A.J. Abrams of Texas. Ponds also broke Abrams' four-game scoring record with 108 points.

2017 - Robert Williams III scored 21 points and pulled down 10 rebounds to lead No. 16 Texas A&M to a 98-87 win over Penn State in the championship game of the Progressive Legends Classic. Williams, who was 10-of-12 from the field against the Nittany Lions, was named the event's MVP. Penn State's Tony Carr did all he could to keep the Lions in the game by tallying 31 points. The Aggies reached the title game with a 72-55 win over Oklahoma State, while Penn State downed Pitt, 85-54, in the semifinals.

2016 - Notre Dame led by as many as 12 points in the second half before fending off Northwestern, 70-66, to win the Legends Classic title. Tournament MVP Matt Farrell and Steve Vasturia scored 18 points apiece for the Irish. In the consolation match, Derrick White scored 16 points as Colorado handed No. 22 Texas its second loss in Brooklyn, 68-54.

2015 - It was billed as a battle of the top freshmen in the country as LSU's Ben Simmons and Marquette's Henry Ellenson led their teams into Brooklyn. When it was over, Ellenson emerged as the tournament's MVP and Marquette emerged as the tournament's champion. In the semifinal, Marquette and Ellenson won the head-to-head battle with an 81-80 win over No. 22 LSU. Trailing 80-79, Simmons, who had 21 points, 20 rebounds, and seven assists, hit a layup with 21 seconds to play before Jajuan Johnson sank a pair of free throws with 11 seconds left to give the Golden Eagles the win. In the final against Arizona State, Ellenson scored 14 points in the second half and overtime to lead the Golden Eagles to a 78-73 victory.

2014 - Dylan Ennis scored 15 points on 6-of-10 shooting from the field, including 3-of-6 from three, to lead No. 12 Villanova to a 60-55 win over No. 19 Michigan in the Legends Classic championship game. The night before it looked like the Wildcats might not play for the title as No. 14 VCU exploded out of halftime, going on a 6-0 run to take a 36-32 lead over the reeling Wildcats. However, Villanova regrouped after a timeout and blew out the Rams by scoring 30 of the next 37 points in less than eight minutes and emerged with a 77-53 win. VCU downed Oregon in the consolation match, 77-63.

2013 - Pitt's Lamar Patterson enjoyed playing in Brooklyn as he posted career highs in consecutive games to lead the Panthers to the Legends Classic championship. In the 76-63 semifinal win versus Texas Tech, Patterson scored 23 points. In the 88-67 win over Stanford for the title, Patterson went for 24 points on 6-of-10 shooting from the field (3-of-6 from three) and 9-of-11 from the line. He also handed out six assists in earning tournament MVP honors.

2012 - The tournament moved from New Jersey to New York and the brand new Barclays Center in Brooklyn. The venue proved the perfect setting as No. 1 Indiana needed overtime to defeat Georgetown, 82-72, in the championship game. In a contest that saw 11 lead changes and six ties, the Hoyas outscored Indiana 8-1 in the final 1:04 of regulation to send the game into overtime on Otto Porter's lay-up with six seconds left. However, Hoosier Jordan Hulls scored six of his team-high 17 points in the extra session to earn tournament MVP honors. The Legends Classic also saw the collegiate debut of UCLA's Shabazz Muhammad, the most heralded freshman in the nation. In his first two games in Brooklyn, Muhammad averaged 18 points to earn all-tournament honors for the No. 13 Bruins.

2011 - In one of the most exciting tournaments of the year, No. 20 Vanderbilt took the Classic crown. The Commodores defeated NC State, 86-79, in the semifinals at the IZOD Center before facing upstart Oregon State in the final, where Brad Tinsley's 15-foot jump shot with 4.5 seconds left gave Vandy a 64-62 win over the Beavers. Oregon State advanced to the final with a thrilling 100-95 overtime win against Texas behind Jared Cunningham's 37-point effort - the second straight game in the Classic in which Cunningham netted a career high. In the consolation game, NC State overcame an 18-point second-half deficit by going on a 28-2 run to capture a 77-74 victory over Texas.

2010 - No. 10 Syracuse took the tournament by the smallest of margins, winning its two Championship Round games by a total of seven points. Rick Jackson dominated for the Orange, averaging 10 points and 13 rebounds en route to MVP honors.

2009 - The Legends Classic moved down the Jersey Shore to historic Boardwalk Hall in Atlantic City and saw Florida emerge on the national stage. Unranked heading into the Classic, the Gators won four games, including a 77-74 semifinal round upset of No. 2 and eventual Final Four participant Michigan State. After a 73-58 win against Rutgers, Florida moved into the national rankings, placing 13th in the AP poll.

2008 - No. 4 Pitt began one of the most magical seasons in school history in the Legends Classic, outscoring its four opponents by an average of 18 points per game and culminating with a 57-43 win over Washington State in the championship match.

2007 - The inaugural Legends Classic took place at the Prudential Center in Newark, N.J., and made an immediate impact on the college basketball landscape with four strong teams playing for the championship - Texas, Tennessee, West Virginia, and New Mexico State. That group included two teams in the preseason Top 15 and, by season's end, three teams in the Top 20. When it was over, No. 16 Texas downed No. 7 Tennessee, 97-78, for the title.
